WASTE	Ensure centre has co-mingled recycling – see commercial services form		
	Source green waste bin service for garden and food waste – see commercial services form		
	Use less paper, convert to electronic journals, email newsletters and re-use one-sided paper		
	Re-use materials such as cardboard boxes, shredded paper, items for craft		
	Set up green trays in the craft area for children to use one-sided paper as scrap paper		
	Promote waste-free lunch days – <u>see low waste lunch</u>		
	Purchase sustainable items like recycled paper towels and toilet paper		
	Sign up to electronic subscriptions to reduce mail		
	Conduct a waste audit, use our how to do a waste audit sheet		
	Collect items such as toothpaste tubes and bread tags though <b>TerraCycle</b> and receive funding for your school		
	Use reusable plastic bags ie bread bags and freezer bags		
	Recycle mobile phones, CDs and DVDs, smoke alarms, light globes and household batteries at Council's admin building and various Libraries <a href="Mobile phones and accessories - Lake">Mobile phones and accessories - Lake</a> <a href="Macquarie City Council">Macquarie City Council</a>		
	NSW EPA provide free Chemical Clean Out-drop-off days across the region		
WATER	Action	Yes	No
	Purchase water efficient appliances. Install tap aerators (\$5) or water efficient shower heads		
	Educate children and staff how to save water (turning taps off, using half flush) etc		
	Ensure washing machines and dishwashers are full before cycles are run, wash clothes in cold water		
	Add mulch to gardens		
	Install a rainwater tank for gardening and sand play		
	Install sensor, mechanical or push timers on taps suitable for children to use		
	Repair water leaks

ENERGY	Use a washing line to dry clothes rather than a dryer		
	Ensure all computers, printers, photocopiers, air conditioners and lights are switched off at the end of the day and turn lights off at night and during outdoor play		
	Replace old light globes to efficient globes such as LED's		
	Install movement sensor lighting, ensure external security lights are on a sensor		
	Install solar panels and solar hot water or a heat pump – see guide for solar panels		
	Use a programmable timer to switch emptied fridges off out of hours over the weekends, and during holidays		
	Ensure staff and children dress appropriately for each season to save on heating and cooling costs		
	Only use an air conditioner when natural ventilation is inadequate, and ensure doors and windows are closed		
	Use a thermometer to ensure your air conditioner is efficient. The temperature should be 18-21°C in winter and 23-26°C in summer		
	Use door snakes and window seals to reduce draughts
