Five years ago, Council looked after one public art gallery and a library service with 50,000 members.

Today, the city has a vibrant theatre and live music scene, creative festivals, urban and public art, and heritage with more than 920,000 people attending an event, exhibition, live theatre or music each and every year.

With exciting venues like the Multi-Arts Pavilion, mima, opening in 2021 and new developments like Black Rock Motor Resort and Cedar Mill in the works, our cultural capital will only continue to grow.

I have revelled in the opportunity to advocate for and deliver beneficial projects like the Lake Macquarie Transport Interchange, Munibung Road extension at Cardiff, The Weir Bridge at Barnsley, Hunter Sports Centre, Kaiyu Nungkiliko expansion, Windale Hub, bilyabayi and many others during my career.

This Council has redefined our city as an active, growing destination in which to live, work and play.

It is testament to the dedication of my fellow councillors and residents for helping shape a cohesive vision to drive us towards a brighter future.

To that end, I encourage you to carefully consider who will represent you next when the September local government election comes around.

Finally, I thank you all for supporting me during my eight-year tenure as Mayor of Lake Macquarie; it has been a true privilege and honour to serve you. All the best,
